

The Circular Economy – A New Sustainability Paradigm?

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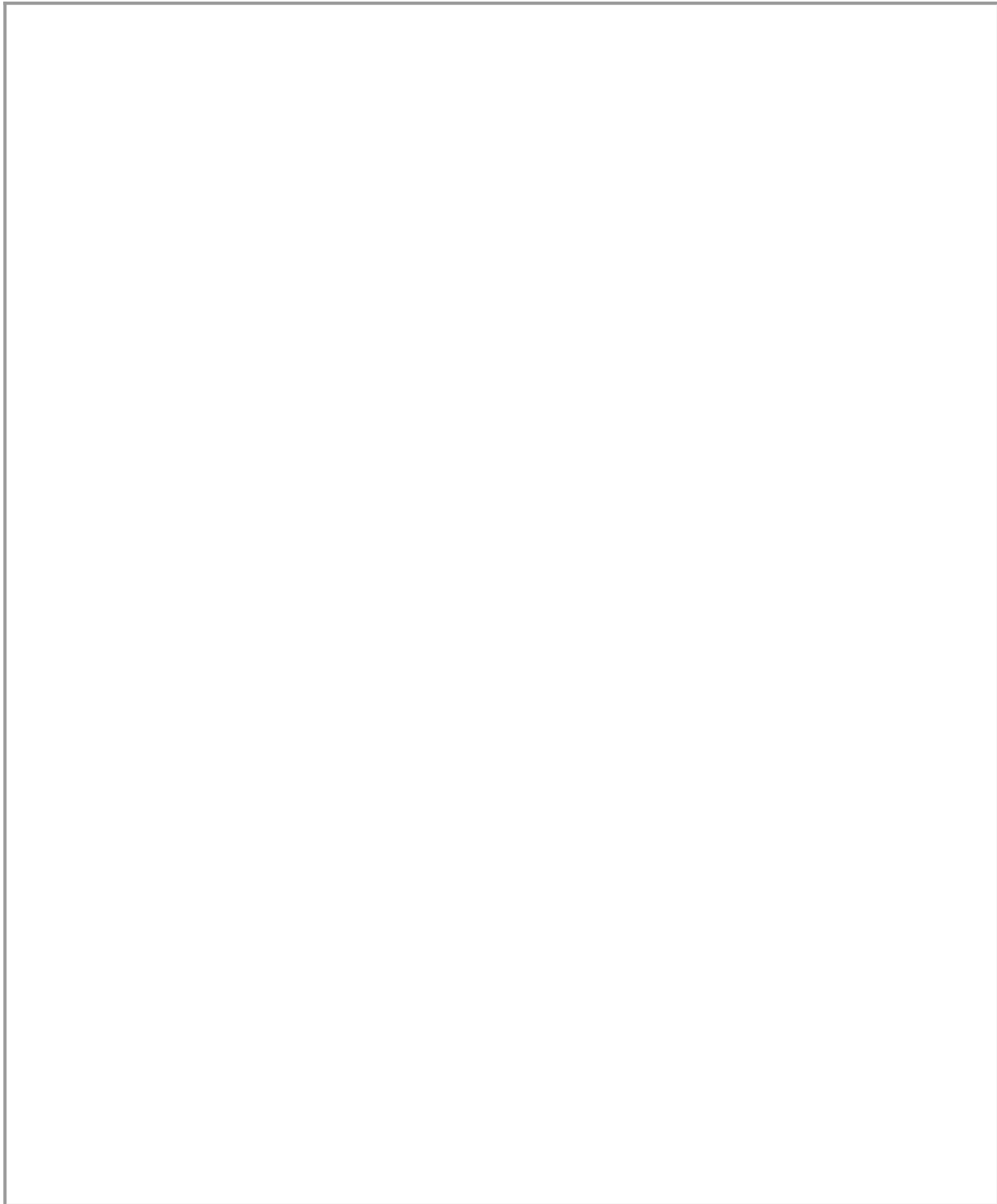
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Why did we conduct this research?
